Examples of the kind of activities that the Tech RRT CMAM advisor can support are:

- Provide strategic advice and operational support on CMAM start-up, roll out or scale up
- Assess capacity in and provide support to implement CMAM or specific weak areas, for example care of infants under 6 months old
- Lead assessments or determine the need for CMAM establishment or scale up
- Facilitate rapid program start-up
- Provide support to improve the coordination of CMAM programmes
- Support to develop a CMAM strategy, mapping and guidelines, when necessary
- Assess CMAM capacity building needs of staff members or partners
- Facilitate trainings, Training of Trainers (TOTs), or orientation sessions
- Monitor CMAM activities and train supervisors in coaching and supportive supervision to improve program quality
- Brief donors and advocate for adequate resource allocation
- Review or lead the development of proposals and budgets to seek funding for CMAM
